

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CLEVELAND HERITAGE COMMISSION

February 8, 2022

Chair Lynn Shurden called the meeting to order at 12:00 P.M.

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

After review of the minutes of the January 2022 meeting, Jordan Goins made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, Judy Wilson seconded the motion. The vote was "aye" with no opposition.

Old Business

Chair Lynn Shurden discussed the commission's finances and discovered an issue. The matter was corrected by the Finance Committee (Michelle Arbuckle).

The election of a new Chair and Vice Chair was tabled until the March 2022 meeting.

New Business

Cetin Oguz submitted an application to install three window cling signs at his business located at 110 B South Court Street. He presented a total of three signs that will be located on the inside of the windows, representing each business that is occupying the space. Jordan Goins made a motion to approve the application, and Judy Wilson seconded the motion. The vote was all in favor of the motion.

Sarah Aylward submitted an application to install windows, doors, and trim at her business located at 341 Cotton Row. She had previously received permission to install new windows, but returned to the Heritage Commission for permission to install the doors with the same materials as the windows. Sarah's application was revised to include a concrete pad at the rear of the building to prevent erosion from rain water and drainage. Corinne Casanova made a motion to approve the application, and Jonett Valentine seconded the motion. The vote was all in favor of the motion.

Discussion


